
## First Year of Express Entry

- 151,722 Express Entry profiles were submitted:
  - 54% of profiles submitted were not accepted into the pool because they did not meet minimum entry criteria.
  - An average of 1,800 new profiles were created each week.
  - As of January 2016, over 57,500 active candidates were in the pool waiting for an invitation to apply.
- A total of 31,063 invitations were issued to foreign nationals:
  - Mix of Provincial Nominees (14%), Federal Skilled Workers (42%), Federal Skilled Trades (8%) and Canadian Experience Class (36%)
  - Just over 62% of candidates have claimed a job offer or a provincial or territorial nomination.
  - Approximately 2% of invitations have gone to candidates who submitted a language test in French for their first official language.
- Almost 10,000 Express Entry candidates landed as permanent residents in 2015
- As of March 9<sup>th</sup>, there have been 8451 invitations issued in 6 rounds in 2016.



## Permanent Residence through Express Entry

- To date the Department has met the commitment to process 80% of applications within six months
- As of January 3, 2016, over 37,000 applications have been received from candidates
- Almost 10,000 Express Entry candidates landed in Canada in 2015
